The 'Classical Art Center' unites organisations involved in internationalisation in the arts, in numerous forms and variants. The focus for now is on visual arts, in particular on skill-based art.

Universal skills

Universal Skills in visual arts are the mastery of composition, form rendering, tone values and colour schemes. And also mastery of all the materials and techniques to be used.

But also insight into expressive values: from velvet poetry to intense drama, and in the use of suggestive means: from intoxicating atmospheres to vicious contrasts.

These are abstract concepts by the way, applicable to every form of visual art.

Cultural differences

There are large cultural differences in the use of these skills worldwide.

In West and East Asia, there is a traditional emphasis on the connection of images with poetry and calligraphy; in South Asia, on relations with mysticism and philosophy (with sometimes abstract results); in Oceania and Africa, on heightened expression and magical meaning, etc., etc.

But whether figurative, deformed or abstract, universal skills play a leading role everywhere.

Skills in representational European art.

In the European tradition, realism - idealised or otherwise - predominates. This requires further knowledge of the suggestion of space through plasticity, through atmospheric and geometric perspective. As well as knowledge of anatomy, comparative anatomy and the ways plants and trees grow. Knowledge of light and reflections, of the expression of material, etc. etc.

Mastery

Good art is based on mastery of all these and similar components, which can be applied in various combinations, to be summarised as the 'skills'.

But for all kinds of reasons, in large parts of the Western world the traditional skills have been relegated to the background or even lost.

Moved by the ripples of time, ever larger groups of artists now want to recapture this mastery: 'skill-based art' is separate from stylistic directions but it is the basis of visual quality.

Initiatives

This reconquest can be supported by exchanging knowledge, by bundling initiatives and know-how worldwide and by bringing artists together.

In September 2018, artists Rein Pol and Tom Hageman (as well as Henk Helmantel and Hilda Snoeier) participated in the 'Fifth Silk Road International Art Festival' (with 289 participating artists from 118 countries) an exhibition at the 'Shaanxi Province Art Museum' hosted by the Ministry of Culture of the Peoples Republic of China and The Peoples Government of Shaanxi Province.

It was organised by the Shaanxi Provincial Department of Culture; co-organizer: 'Xi'an University for Architecture and Technology/College of Arts, XUAT, and the World Art League.



Tom Hageman and **Rein Pol** both gave a lecture/powerpoint presentation for students of the XUAT. Rein Pol on his own work, Tom Hageman on "East is East and West is West/artistic interactions between east and west from the 16th century onwards." (the latter lecture was repeated in July 2019 at Pulchri Studio, The Hague). Both were thereby officially accredited as visiting professors at the XUAT



Xi'an University of Architecture and Technology: Agreements

Tom Hageman signed cooperation agreements with XUAT and the 'World Art League' on behalf of the Classical Art Center. Included forming a new delegation in 2019 at the invitation of the Shaanxi provincial government for more contacts/agreements,

The Dean of the 'College of Arts' and the editor/planner/critic of national art magazines (Art World Magazine; Art Idea Magazine and China Art Weekly) will henceforth act as 'Consultant East Asia', (respectively artistic and PR) for and on behalf of the ILFAS Foundation

Very specific was the agreement to exchange exhibitions of Chinese artists in the Netherlands and vice versa. The first exhibition - China in the Netherlands - was planned for spring 2019, the follow-up - Netherlands in China - for autumn 2019.

6th Silk Road International Art Festival Xi'an, China 2019.

For the 6th international Art Exhibition-2019 in Xi'an, 306 artists from 116 countries were invited. 47 artists from the Chinese mainland, 5 from HongKong, Macao and Taiwan, 254 from countries all over the world. In 2019 a special presentation from the Netherlands was part of this event with 14 Dutch artists; 11 of them were selected by the Dutch foundation "International League of Fine Art Schools" ILFAS A delegation of these Dutch artists visited China in September 2019: **Tom Hageman** and **Jishu Li**, resp.

Speakers included Corinne Wagner, professor at the University of Exeter, on the relationship between the human figure and contemporary values and expectations.

Jane Clathworthy, painter: "The male nude is underexposed in modern figuration. There is even a denial of the beauty of the male body. The man is never portraved vulnerably. Is the use of anatomical knowledge necessary for this, or does it stand in the way of the depiction of a contemporary male image?"

Tamsin Spargo, student of London Metropolitan University in Fine Art: "My conceptual studies do not answer questions such as: how do I use 'the figure' and is the depiction of figures still relevant in the depiction of existential questions?"

Questions about art as a commodity are also discussed:

Wendy Elia, painter: "*My paintings are very personal and take place in my own limited* living space, in my living room. Still, I think there should be a boundary between me and the public. There must be room for interpretation by the spectator. My personal or political views should not be imposed. I wonder how other figurative artists deal with this." None of those present doubted the meaning of painting. Also having concrete control over the medium, especially in a digital age, was considered important.
